Niagara Hospice has been providing expert care and caregiver support to families since 1988. Staff provides patients, families and caregivers with the physical, emotional, psychosocial, spiritual and bereavement care they need.

Hospice is a way of caring for patients with a terminal illness. Services are available when a prognosis is approximately six months or less (12 months for strictly Medicaid recipients). Some patients receive care beyond six months.

Niagara Hospice provides patients and families with telehealth and videoconferencing that enable faster consultations and admissions. These services also enhance care management and medical monitoring.

Hospice gives comfort when a cure is no longer feasible and hope that a familiar setting can be enjoyed with dignity.

Additionally, hospice is committed to supporting the family after the death of a loved one. Many families have said that choosing hospice allowed them more time together.

Your Hospice Team

The primary goal of the hospice team is to provide comfort by managing symptoms and supporting the patient's caregivers and primary physician.

Therapy services include speech, occupational, respiratory and physical. Other supportive services include nutrition consults and medical equipment specialists. Our team provides education and training to caregivers to care for their loved one.

Social workers assist the patient and family with advance care planning and completing financial and insurance paperwork. Social workers and spiritual care counselors work with the patient and family to help alleviate emotional stress that can be experienced. Pet visits, music therapy and massage therapy are available to help reduce anxiety and stress.

Hospice House

For individuals who do not have a home environment appropriate for hospice or lack the family to provide 24/7 care at home, Hospice House or a hospice unit at a skilled nursing facility may be the best option to receive the best care possible. Hospice House has residential suites designed for peaceful long-term care and inpatient suites for short-term symptom management.

Niagara Hospice collaborates with skilled nursing facilities in Niagara County to provide their residents with dedicated hospice care units in a long-term care setting. Jeanne's House at Northgate Health Care Facility and David's Path at Schoellkopf Health Center are devoted to meeting the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of residents requiring 24-hour skilled nursing care and specialized hospice care.

When should I call?

Hospice care is an option for individuals with serious illnesses, such as heart disease, lung disease, neuromuscular diseases, cancer, Alzheimer's and dementia. The time to learn about hospice is before symptoms and pain become difficult to manage.

Who can make a referral?

Anyone. Referrals are made by family, friends, clergy, physicians and staff at health care facilities. Patients may call us themselves. We receive as many referrals from family members as we do from hospitals and facilities.

How is hospice paid for?

Hospice is covered under Medicare, Medicaid, most private insurance plans, HMOs and other managed care organizations. No one is denied care due to inability to pay.

Payment for services not provided in the home

Niagara Hospice maintains contracts with hospitals, nursing homes and adult care facilities. While our services typically involve no expense, each contract provider may charge fees associated with room and board and services for care unrelated to the diagnosis.

Spirituality can be described as "That which gives meaning to life." Compassionate, non-judgmental spiritual care counselors are available to **people of all faiths** and **people of no faith**. Our skilled counselors can assist with identifying and honoring personal beliefs, as well as find ways to nurture the spirit. Counselors can also provide support through the creation of individualized rituals that give meaning to the purpose of life, suffering, forgiveness and the progressive losses that accompany a life-limiting illness.

The time following the death of a loved one can be very difficult and overwhelming. A very important service of Niagara Hospice, and one that is unique from other health care providers, is bereavement care.

Counselors are available to provide support to family members for up to 13 months after the death of their loved one. Services include individual grief counseling, support groups, a grief library and memorial events.
