Symptom Management for Home Care

The general inpatients unit features 10 private suites that provide short-term acute care. Through 24/7 medical monitoring, staff helps bring pain and symptoms under control, alleviating the need for emergency room visits and hospitalizations. This often results in a quicker return to home. The general inpatient wing also has four isolation rooms that accommodate illnesses with airborne contagions to protect everyone. Respite care is also offered, based on room availability, for families needing a break or traveling.

The residential care wing features 16 private suites. Each suite is designed with patient and family in mind with a sitting area and easychair sleeper. Every family also has access to gathering rooms, fireplaces, a chapel and Niagara Hospice memorial gardens.
