What is We Honor Veterans (WHV)?

- National awareness and action campaign
- Developed by National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO)
- In collaboration with Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)
- Encourage partnerships between community hospices, state hospice organizations and VA facilities



We Honor Veterans Campaign Goals

- Promote Veteran-centric educational activities
- Increase organizational capacity to serve Veterans
- Support development of strategic partnerships
- Increase access and improve quality



What is "Veteran-centric"?

- Focuses on the needs, desires and treatment of our Veterans
- Requires Veteran responsibility and accountability
- Depends on communication, coordination and collaboration among healthcare providers

How to get Hospice Care

- Talk with a local physician
- Call a local hospice provider

- Contact your nearest VA hospital or clinic to inquire about benefits

A physician's order is required to start hospice services

When you choose hospice care, you & your family are provided with:

The Right People ...

- Physicians
- PharmD
- Nurses
- Hospice Aides
- Homemakers
- Social Workers
- Spiritual Care Counselors
- Ancillary Therapists
- Bereavement Counselors
- Trained volunteers



Your Physician...

- Directs hospice medical care
- Consults with your hospice nurse
- Communicates with "the right people" on the hospice staff regularly



Hospice Nurses

- The Hospice Nurse is the Case Manager who routinely visits patients
- Perform physical assessments
- Teach families how to care for the patient
- Provide "what to expect" education
- Are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week



Hospice Aides and Homemakers

- Provide bathing & personal care
- Perform light housekeeping as needed
- Assist with activities
- Help with simple meal preparation



Social Workers

- Provide emotional support
- Help identify community resources

Spiritual Care Counselors

 Provide spiritual support to the patient & family, as desired

Bereavement Counselors

 Provide grief support for patients and families



Volunteers

- Run errands
- Provide companionship
- Read, play games
- Listen
- Comfort
- Provide pet and music visits
- Give the "gift of presence"

... and so much more!



What other kinds of services will I get?

- Supplies
- Medications for symptoms, comfort & safety
- Use of a 24-hour pharmacy
- Medical equipment such as hospital beds, wheelchairs & bedside toilets
- Personal Emergency Response Systems



Where is Hospice Provided?

... anywhere you call home!

Outpatient

- Your home or your caregiver's home
- Nursing home
- Assisted living facility

Inpatient

- Local hospital
- Local VA hospital
- Niagara Hospice House



Funding Sources

All are served, regardless of ability to pay!

- Medicare A
- Medicaid
- Most private insurance
- VA



What You Should Know

- Hospice care can last *longer* than six months
- You can stop hospice at any time
- Hospice is for more than just patients with cancer

(Only approximately 39% of Niagara Hospice patients in the past year have had *cancer*)

 At Niagara Hospice, you are always under the care of a doctor and YOU choose your personal doctor
